



## 2014 – 2015 The Year in Review

Founded on March 24, 1891, Ladies Musical Club (LMC) continues to foster an appreciation of classical music within our community. With over 120 members, LMC has reached many children, students and adults who otherwise would not have had access to our excellent programs. Your commitment enabled us to add immeasurable value to the arts and culture in our community.

#### **Public Concerts**



Between October 2014 and May 2015, our public concerts reached approximately 2,700 people at the Seattle Art Museum (476), Frye Art Museum (653), the main branch of the Seattle Public Library (399), West Seattle Library (264), University House Wallingford (260), Mirabella (354), the Ballard Oddfellows Lodge (111) and our new venue the Theater at Crossroads Community Center in Bellevue (178).

This year we will be replacing the Ballard Oddfellows Lodge with the Music Center of the Northwest in North Seattle.

Concerts are scheduled for the fourth Sunday of each month throughout 2014-2015. This venue has the benefits of a real recital environment with a concert quality grand piano, a harpsichord and a recital stage. Additionally, LMC will run a three-concert season at Stage 7 Pianos in Kirkland. These concerts will be at 3pm on the third Sundays in November, January, and March. This venue has a Steinway Concert Grand Model D on site.

## **Music In Schools Program (MIS)**

The 2014-2015 school year was the 24th year of Music in Schools Outreach Program, providing music education in schools that are underserved in music education funding . We reached approximately 6,500 students in six elementary schools through 15 interactive presentations and activities. The five regularly participating schools were Licton Springs, Lowell, Rainier View, Sand Point and Sanislo. MIS also established a before-school chorus at B. F. Day Elementary.

In collaboration with the UW World Series, MIS provided presentations by the Miró Quartet and The Nile Project.

The Nile Project

included musicians from Burundi, Sudan and Kenya.

#### **Frances Walton Competition**

The June 2014 competition drew many highly talented and accomplished musicians. Winners of the 2014 Competition: Benjamin Adler, clarinet (Brooklyn NY - L.A., CA), Jeff Siegfried, saxophone (Bellingham WA), Aaron Conitz, viola (Fircrest WA), Joshua Romatowski, flute (Puyallup WA) and Chapman Duo (Chloé Tardif, violin and Nickolas Kaynor, viola), Orange CA.

Winners performed on KING-FM's NW Focus Live: Joshua Romatowski, alternate Winner Andrew Chen (piano) and the Chapman Duo in September, and Jeff Siegfried and 2000 Winner Dainius Vaicekonis (piano) in March. Recitals were performed in eastern King County, Yakima, Chelan, Omak, Raymond, Forks, Ferndale, Shoreline, Snohomish, and Sammamish. Schools were visited in Yakima, East Wenatchee, Cashmere, Chelan, Pateros, Omak, Okanogan, Oroville, Brewster, Raymond, Winlock, Aberdeen, Chehalis, Ferndale, Sumas, Everson, Sammamish, Issaquah, Renton, Shoreline, Kenmore and Bothell. Many of these communities have limited or no access to classical music performances.
