This past year has been one for the record books. Dramatic changes came in our circumstances with breakthrough vaccinations and resurgences. All this upheaval has made me prouder than ever of Ladies Musical Club. We have made successful innovations in all areas.

Member concerts pivoted to online formats, reaching more viewers than ever with brilliant thematic organization. Viewers were able to watch live premieres of "Virtual Happy Hour" showings and revisit them online later. In March, we celebrated our 130th anniversary with a virtual toast, some exceptional performances of music played at LMC's first meeting in 1891, and some stories about our history. We also saw an increased social media presence with outreach in many areas.

The Music in Schools program has also filmed their most popular artists and has made them available to schools, an excellent opportunity for teachers to refine and review the performances and to keep a record of these performer/educators for future reference when they can again perform live in the schools. We plan to resume in-person school assemblies in 2022.

The Frances Walton Competition has been revamped this year in hiatus through extensive, careful planning made with expert guidance. Next year's finals will take place June 4th, 2022 at University Congregational United Church of Christ, an excellent facility and central location. Our new program we will reach a greater number of contestants.

Our Archives have been expanded and refined with more digitizing and improved search capabilities. We are fortunate to have two trained archivists in LMC to help us record LMC's groundbreaking Seattle history. LMC's biography is delayed because of closures but we anticipate its publication next year.

Our biggest first is the Board's long-needed decision to hire LMC's first Executive Director, Dr. Whitney Henderson, as of June 1st. The Board did an executive search on nationwide job sites, conducted interviews and found the very best candidate here in our midst. Whitney is taking the stress off talented and busy Board and committee members who need support in carrying out our mission. A nationally recognized music historian, experienced grant writer, teacher, and strategic planner, Whitney's wealth of professional experience as well as enthusiasm for all things LMC is a perfect fit, and we are all pleased.

About LMC

Founded in March of 1891, Ladies Musical Club (LMC) of Seattle continues to foster an appreciation of classical music within our community. With more than 100 members, LMC has reached many children, students, and adults who otherwise would not have had access to our excellent programs. Once again, your commitment enabled us to add immeasurable value to arts and culture in our community.

LMC Archives

The LMC Historical Archives Preservation and Digitization Project currently boasts more than 4,000 digitized pages, many of which are posted on the LMC's website at https://lmcseattle.org/about/history/lmc-digital-archives/. Secretary's books—with insight into the club's daily workings—and artist photographs of performers who the LMC presented have been posted recently.

The LMC celebrated our 130th anniversary this season, adding one more year to our long history of enriching the Seattle community through music. With ongoing COVID lockdowns, all of the LMC's archival holdings at the Museum of History and Industry (MOHAI) remain inaccessible. Despite this, the Archives Committee had a productive year with several projects underway.

The pandemic has proven the significance of our LMC Historical Preservation and Digitization Project, generously funded by 4Culture grants, the City Arts Fund, and private donations. The LMC purchased a high-resolution scanner so we are able to digitize artifacts in-house as they come in. We received two generous artifact donations that are currently being processed. Our digital archive (https://lmcseattle.org/about/history/lmc-digital-archives/) was redesigned on the website and continues to grow as new documents are digitized, and we continue to index concert programs in the historical Members' Books for searchability. And, the LMC's archivist conducted oral history interviews with several 50 year members while documenting the LMC's history for the history book, due out this upcoming season.

As the LMC continues to make history, the Archives Committee continues preserving it for current and future generations of LMC members and the greater community!

Public Concerts

LMC sponsors free concerts each season (October–May), at a variety of venues throughout Seattle and the Eastside, as well as virtual concerts streamed online. Featuring our performing members and their guests, these concerts reach broadly across ethnic groups and economic levels to provide free, live musical experiences that might not otherwise be available to these populations.

For the 2020-2021 virtual concert season, we produced 28 concerts of 15-30 minutes in length. Almost all of these were themed concerts comprised of two or more performers, rather than traditional solo recitals.

We hoped to be in-person again in 2021-2022, with six live concerts plus one 1/2-hour virtual happy hour concert each month. However, due to health and safety restrictions, we will continue to produce virtual concerts, offering both individual and collaborative programming through at least December 2021.

Frances Walton Competition

Each year, outstanding young musicians compete for substantial cash prizes and recognition in this prestigious competition.

In March 2020, the Frances Walton Competition (FWC) was placed on hiatus because of the pandemic. This hiatus was extended to two seasons in order for us to thoroughly study the present program as well as investigate other similar competitions in the United States, look at the many aspects of the FWC, investigate broadening the application pool to all fifty U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. Territories, study how best to market the FWC, and begin the process of producing documentation and a procedural manual for the program.

We gathered invaluable information for marketing, documentation, and overall experience of both the FWC finals and tours, and have also assembled an Advisory Committee, consisting of various members of our Arts community, that will give expert opinions and guidance.

The FWC Research Committee is moving forward into a new season, dropping the "Research" part of our committee's name, and proceeding with what we hope will be a period of growth for the program. Applications went live in the fall of 2021 through the secondary application platform, Getacceptd.com. The FWC Finals and Winners Concert are scheduled for June 2022.

Music In Schools (MIS) Program

The Music In Schools (MIS) outreach program embarked on its thirtieth year of providing free musical enrichment to underserved students in Seattle public elementary schools. Although we were unable to provide in-person musical experiences due to the pandemic school closures, we seized the opportunity to video record many of our most requested artists/teachers:


We plan to record more artists as they become available and will begin live streaming of concerts for school assemblies in 2022.

We also contributed to an online dance workshop at John Muir School with the Gansango Dance Ensemble.




