Clifford Curzon, famed British pianist, in L.M.C. concert at the Met, Feb. 5.

CLIFFORD CURZON, the great British pianist who makes his first appearance in Seattle Monday evening, February 5th, in a Ladies' Musical Club artist-series concert at the Metropolitan, is a prodigious performer of the old line-a type not seen so often these days. New York critics had to fetch up memories of Rachmaninoff's and Busoni's playing when they tried to describe the effect Curzon obtained with the Liszt piano sonata. But this was in 1947, when the British virtuoso made his first post-war American tour. He had been to America earlier, playing three concertos in one evening (out of his repertoire of 53 concertos) with an orchestra under Alexander Smallens in 1939, and reaping critical raptures of which he could take no advantage when World War II intervened. By 1939 he was already 32 and one of the foremost pianists of Europe. He had entered the Royal Academy of Music in London at the unprecedented age of 12 and after studying with a pupil of Liszt and with the great Tobias Matthay, had joined the Academy's faculty while still an adolescent. Happening to hear Schnabel play Schubert, he felt that he had come across a revelation and dashed off to Berlin to study with Schnabel. A fellowstudent under Schnabel in 1929 was an American girl, Lucille Wallace, now a fa-

mous harpsichordist in Britain, who became Mrs. Curzon in 1931. Curzon studied later in Paris with Wanda Landowska, the eminent harpsichordist, and with Nadia Boulanger, teacher of many American composers, before embarking finally on his concert career.

As a concert pianist, Curzon has tried to re-create the music of the 19th century somewhat as Landowska had tried to re-awaken the keyboard music of the 18th century. Feeling that the "feel" of the keyboard is even more important than actual finger dexterity, Curzon works constantly—four to six hours a day—while on tour with an adjustable dummy keyboard (parenthetically, he is listed also as a chain smoker, so he must be a busy man while touring).

## THE LADIES MUSICAL CLUB

of Seattle, Washington

Article I-Members

The Ladies Musical Club of Seattle, Washington, is a corporation of women formed for the purpose of developing musical interest in Seattle.

Article II

Section 1. There shall be two classes of members: Active and Associate.

Sec. 2. The Active members of the club shall consist exclusively of women. The Associate membership shall include both

men and women.

Sec. 3. The Active members of the club shall be limited to 250 persons and shall consist of those who shall be such at the time of the adoption of these by-laws, and those who shall be admitted to active membership according to provisions herein provided. They alone shall be eligible to vote and to take part in the deliberations and conduct of the Club.

Sec. 4. Qualifications for Active membership in the Club shall be musicianship and the ability to do active work in the Club. Prospective Active members must be able to make a creditable public appearance in their own field, or be outstanding in some field of musical achievement. Prospective Active members shall be invited by the Executive Board, according to the following procedure:

1. Upon the request of two Active members for application blanks, said blanks to be filled out and returned to the president. 2. The president shall give this form to the chairman of the membership committee, who shall give it to the chairman

of the proper sub-committee.

3. The sponsoring members shall confer with the president, so that the prospective member may be heard by the sub-committee, on a representative program on which she is appearing, or on one of the semi-annual auditions held by the entire membership committee. The president may, if necessary, appoint substitute members for the membership committee or any of its sub-committees.

4. If the membership committee approves of a candidate, and if the Executive Board votes in the affirmative, the can-

didate shall receive an invitation to Active membership.

Sec. 5. The number of non-performing members accepted each year shall be limited to one, or not more than 10 percent of the total number of new performing Active members accepted during the preceding year.

Sec. 6. All Active members shall hold themselves in read ness

to contribute to the programs when requested.

Article III-Officers

Sec. 1. The management of the Club shall be vested in a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and 10 Trustees, who shall hold their offices for one year or until their successors are elected. Said officers and trustees shall constitute the Executive Board and shall have power to fill any vacancy that may occur in their number.

Sec. 2. Officers and Trustees shall be elected by ballot as di-

rected in Article IX.

Article IV-Duties of Officers

Sec. 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and Executive Board; shall appoint all committees unless otherwise provided in these By-laws and shall be ex-officio member of the same.

Sec. 2. The Vice-President shall, in the absence of the Presi-

dent, perform all the duties of the President.

Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Club and Executive Board and shall record the attendance of members at Active Members meeting, keep a complete list of all Active members.

Sec. 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall attend to all correspondence of the Club, and shall, when the President calls a Board meeting, notify the members of the time and place

thereof.

Sec. 5. The Treasurer of the Club shall receive, and subject to Art. XI hereof, have control of all money of the Club, except that pertaining to the Concert Series or Committee. She shall pay all bills of general Club expense; shall keep a full account of the finances of the Club, and present a monthly statement of the same at the Active meetings.

Article V-Committees

Sec. 1. Membership Committee. The President shall appoint annually a Membership Committee, consisting of five vocalists, five pianists, five stringed instrumentalists, and five representing organ and composition, who, with the Executive Board, shall pass upon applicants for Active membership. The Presi-

dent shall appoint the chairman of this committee.

Sec. 2. Program Committee. The President shall appoint a Program Committee, consisting of three members, who shall outline the work for the ensuing year and submit the same to the Executive Board for approval.

The program committee shall arrange programs, attend to the printing of the same, order pianos, music stands, etc. The number of assisting artists and their fees shall be referred to

the Executive Board.

No woman not a member of the Club, shall be permitted to perform on a program unless she is a non-resident of Seattle or an ensemble performer.

Open Concerts shall be held on the second Monday of each

month during the Club season at 2:30 P.M.

Sec. 3. Social Committee. The President shall appoint a Social Committee of Three Active members who shall serve at every meeting, introduce new members and attend to the social

functions of such meetings.

Sec. 4. Concert Committee. There shall be a standing committee known as the Concert Committee. This committee shall be composed of five active members from the Club—a Concert Committee Chairman, a Concert Committee Assistant Chairman, a Concert Committee Treasurer and two other members, chosen by the Concert Committee Chairman from the active membership with the approval of the Board of Trustees.

The three officers of this committee shall be appointed by the Board from the Board, immediately after each annual election. The Concert Committee Chairman shall have had

previous Board experience.

The Concert Committee shall be vested with the authority to select the artists for the Concert Series, to manage the Artist Recitals, to attend to all details incident thereto, and shall keep in close touch with the financial condition of the Club.

The Concert Committee Chairman shall present a comprehensive report, quarterly to the Board. She shall present a statement of the result of each concert at the Active members

meeting following the concert.

The Concert Committee Treasurer shall receive, and deposit all dues (money for the concert series), receive and disburse all money received from the sale of tickets, attend to the payment of all taxes relative to concert tickets and make payments for any other financial obligations of the Concert Series.

Sec. 5. House Committee. The President shall appoint a house committee which shall make any necessary arrangements

with the hotel for open meetings, and shall choose homes for the closed meetings. They shall arrange for hostesses for all open and closed meetings, provide chairs for closed meetings.

Sec. 6. Finance Committee. This committee is composed of Club Treasurer as Chairman and two members of the Board of Trustees. They shall care for and re-invest the Ladies Musical Club Fund.

Sec. 7. Telephone Committee. Sec. 8. Hospitality Committee.

Sec. 9. Attendance Committee. Sec. 10. Scrap Book Committee.

Sec. 11. Publicity Chairman—Concert. Sec. 12. Publicity Chairman—Social.

Sec. 13. Advertising Distribution Committee.

Sec. 14. Archivist.

Sec. 15. Loan Fund-Section 2 Article XI.

Sec. 16. By-Law Revision Committee.

Sec. 17. Librarian.

Article VI-Club Meetings

Sec. 1. Active members meetings shall be held on the fourth Monday of each month during the Club season, at 1:30 P.M. Sec. 2. The meeting on the fourth Monday in May of each year shall be known as the annual meeting.

Sec. 3. Notices of special meetings must be mailed to the active membership two weeks before the appointed time and

must state the purpose of the Special meeting.

Article VII-Fees

Sec. 1. The annual dues shall be as follows: Active members \$10.00; Associate members \$10.00, payable at the beginning of each season.

Sec. 2. Active members who have forfeited their membership for non-payment of dues, may be reinstated upon the payment

of one year's arrears and the current dues.

Sec. 3. Active members who have been absent from the city one year or more and have not kept up their current dues, may be reinstated upon the payment of one year's dues, or if qualified, may be reinstated upon the action of the Board.

Article VIII

The Executive Board shall annually appoint an Auditor to whom the outgoing Treasurer shall submit the financial account of the Club.

Article IX—Nomination and Election of Officers
Sec. 1. Election of officers shall take place annually, the result of which shall be announced at the Annual Meeting.

Sec. 2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five Active members, two of whom shall be appointed by the President from the Board. The other three members shall be elected by written ballot of the Active membership who will select at least two names from a list of seven submitted by the Executive Board, the third name to be chosen from said list, or an individual choice supplied in the space provided.

This list of seven names shall be sent to each Active member by the Corresponding Secretary, and the marked ballots returned by mail to the Head Teller—appointed by the President or handed to the Head Teller before 1:00 P.M. on the day of the April Active meeting. Ballots must be enclosed in an envelope marked with the sender's name. The President will instruct the elected committee to convene as soon as possible and choose their own Chairman.

Sec. 3. The Nominating Committee then shall nominate one candidate for each position on the Executive Board. At least two weeks before the Annual meeting in May, this list of candidates shall be mailed to each Active member by the Corresponding Secretary together with the date of the Annual meeting. These ballots may be returned by mail or in person to the Head Teller in a sealed envelope marked with the sender's name before 1:00 P.M. on the day of the Annual Meeting.

Sec. 4. Additional candidates for positions on the Board may be nominated by a group of ten or more Active members who submit the name or names in writing with the consent of the nominees. (These ten members cannot be members of the Nominating Committee.) Nominees' names must bear the signature of these ten or more sponsors, and said lists shall be delivered to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee by May 1st. When additional names appear on the ballot they will be designated as having been nominated by the membership at large.

Sec. 5. A plurality of all votes cast shall elect.

Article X-Quorums

Sec. 1. One-sixth of the active paid up resident membership of the previous year shall constitute a quorum at all active members' meetings; eight members shall constitute a quorum of the Executive Board.

Article XI-Ladies Musical Club Fund

Sec. 1. All money invested by the club in mortgages or other securities, shall constitute the "Ladies Musical Club Fund" and shall be used only for the furtherance and promotion of the musical work of the organization. This fund shall be controlled

by the Finance Committee, Club Treasurer as chairman, and two members of the Executive Board. They shall care for and reinvest the "Ladies Musical Club Fund".

Sec. 2. There shall be a Loan Fund from which loans may be made without interest to any music student not over twenty-five years of age, who lives in Seattle, Washington. Names of applicants for the loan must be submitted to the Board of Trustees, which shall decide the eligibility of the applicant and the amount of the loan. The Board may waive the age limit of the applicant if she is an active member of the club in good standing.

Article XII-Indebtedness and Expenditure

No indebtedness shall be incurred or expenditure made without the authorization and approval of the Executive Board.

Article XIII

No member of the club as such, shall receive any financial profit or gain; and in case of the dis-incorporation of the club but not otherwise, all of its property and assets together with the increment thereto, shall become and be the property of the City of Seattle to be held and used by said City for the purpose of building or assisting in the building of an auditorium or Temple of Music.

Article XIV

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or Special Active meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the Active members present, notice of the intention to amend forming a part of the call of the meeting.
